
FULBRIGHT U.S. STUDENT PROGRAM GRANTEE

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program offers research, study, and teaching opportunities in over 140 countries. Brandi's Fulbright English Teaching Assistantship in Kenya was cut short due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Brandi reapplied and was granted a second Fulbright to return to Kenya.

"I think the biggest lesson I learned from my experience is that everything happened for a reason! Because my Fulbright ended unexpectedly, I returned home and immediately started my first year of teaching at a school district I loved. I came back and finished graduate school, transitioning from a first-generation undergraduate graduate to a first-generation graduate of grad school. I received another Fulbright in an even more amazing location than my last, built closer connections with people, and was even able to come back home to my school district and my students who had waited for me. Everything aligned perfectly. When something is meant for you, it will happen. If not, that may mean something even greater is waiting."

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program offers research, study, and teaching opportunities in over 140 countries. Eddy's Fulbright English Teaching Assistantship to Brazil, awarded in 2020, was delayed by two years due to the Covid Pandemic.

"The delay allowed me to get a job as a Project Finance Reporter for Infralogic, covering Latin American infrastructure and energy projects. I spoke Spanish and Portuguese with sources while advancing my understanding of politics and economic development within South America. Come April 2022, I was more experienced and excited to apply what I learned during COVID to my placement."

The Gilman Scholarship supports American students in language and cultural study abroad programs in diverse regions across the globe. Kelena's experience was affected due to the COVID pandemic, but Kelena found a way to conduct her Gilman project virtually.

"My virtual study abroad provided me with the opportunity to learn about gender inequalities from a global perspective while trying something new. Despite COVID, I still felt greatly a part of the work being done at the Women's Safe House Sustenance Initiative. Shelter in place orders in the country meant that there was a 149% increase in the incidence of violence against Nigerian women and girls. With no other choice the organization had to adapt to finding virtual means to reach clientele and support those in need. My advice to future scholars is to be malleable and open to non-traditional opportunities."

As a Schwarzman Scholar, Opeyemi was admitted to a master's program in Global Affairs at Tsinghua University in Beijing, China. While the program started in-person in the fall of 2019, because of COVID, Opeyemi had to finish her program online.

"Sharing the experience with other scholars and being honest about the impact it had on us personally and academically anchored me and helped me persevere emotionally. Despite the disruption, I am still so grateful for my Schwarzman experience—I met such incredible people who continue to be a part of my life. To Posse scholars I would encourage them to take the leap when applying for fellowships. None of us know what tomorrow holds but it is still important to take advantage of these opportunities and see what you can gain from them. Life has a funny way of working things out if you're a little flexible and adaptable."
